Oliver Pierce assisted the IUP musicians as they led us in worship each night and Nate Bower from Akron organized team sports. All the campus ministers taught seminars.

Summer Reflections



"But thanks be to God, who in Christ always leads us in triumphal procession, and through us spreads the fragrance of the knowledge of him everywhere."

2 Corinthians 2:14

The past twelve months have been hard on everyone. We

very quickly "Zoomed out" from trying to learn and work by video connections. Pastors and teachers have tried valiantly to hold their people together and accomplish something, and have been berated by irate parishioners for their efforts. It has been tough on the Mid-Atlantic campus ministries, but they have persevered and seen some progress. Many of us feel on the edge of discouragement – if we are not already there.

Paul encourages us with this reminder that we are in God's triumphal procession. A victorious Roman general was granted the honor of leading a parade through Rome along with his lieutenants and the defeated enemy following behind in chains. Paul uses this custom to describe our ministry. As we go about ministering the gospel, God goes before us and our enemies – the world, the flesh, and the devil – fall into line as captives. But whereas a Roman general might be given a triumph rarely, God is leading a triumph every day! Wherever we go God "always leads us in triumphal procession—" no matter what we see or how we feel about it. At times we will not see much happening. At times we will become discouraged. This is normal for mortal human beings. But there is an amazing spiritual reality behind appearances or feelings. The truth is that God is always conquering His enemies!

But this triumphal procession is "in Christ." Any efforts we make in our own strength will falter, and we do not have the power to triumph over sin and discouragement. This is a reminder to cling to Christ, who is our strength and our life. As we do, we are assured that we participate in God's great victory in our world.
