Sunday

*and by your great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night;
for the love of your only Son, our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.*

Wednesday

O God, the life of all who live, the light of the faithful,

the strength of those who labor, and the repose of the dead:

We thank you for the blessings of the day that is past,

and humbly ask for your protection through the coming night.

Bring us in safety to the morning hours;

through him who died and rose again for us,

your Son our Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.

Thursday

Lord Jesus, stay with us, for evening is at hand and the day is past;

be our companion in the way, kindle our hearts, and awaken hope,

that we may know you as you are revealed in Scripture

and the breaking of bread.

Grant this for the sake of your love. Amen.

Friday

Lord Jesus Christ, by your death you took away the sting of death:

Grant to us your servants so to follow in faith where you have led the way,

that we may at length fall asleep peacefully in you

and wake up in your likeness;

for your tender mercies' sake. Amen.

Saturday

O God, the source of eternal light:

Shed forth your unending day upon us who watch for you,

*that our lips may praise you, our lives may bless you,
and our worship on the morrow give you glory;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.*

General Intercession

*O God, the Creator and Preserver of all mankind,
We humbly beseech you for all sorts and conditions of men;
that you would be pleased to make your ways known unto them,
your saving health to all nations.*

*We pray for your watchful care and gracious guidance
of all those in authority,
that we may live quiet and peaceful lives,
and that our nation may receive your blessing.*

*Especially we pray for your holy church universal;
that it may be so guided and governed by your good Spirit,
that all who profess and call themselves Christians
may be led into the way of truth, and hold the faith in unity of spirit,
in the bond of peace, and in righteousness of life.*

*Finally, we commend to your fatherly goodness all those
who are in any way afflicted or distressed, in mind, body, or estate;
that it may please you to comfort and relieve them,
according to their several necessities;
giving them patience under their sufferings,
and a happy issue out of all their afflictions.*
